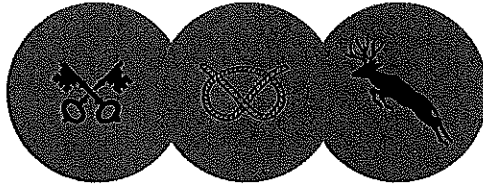

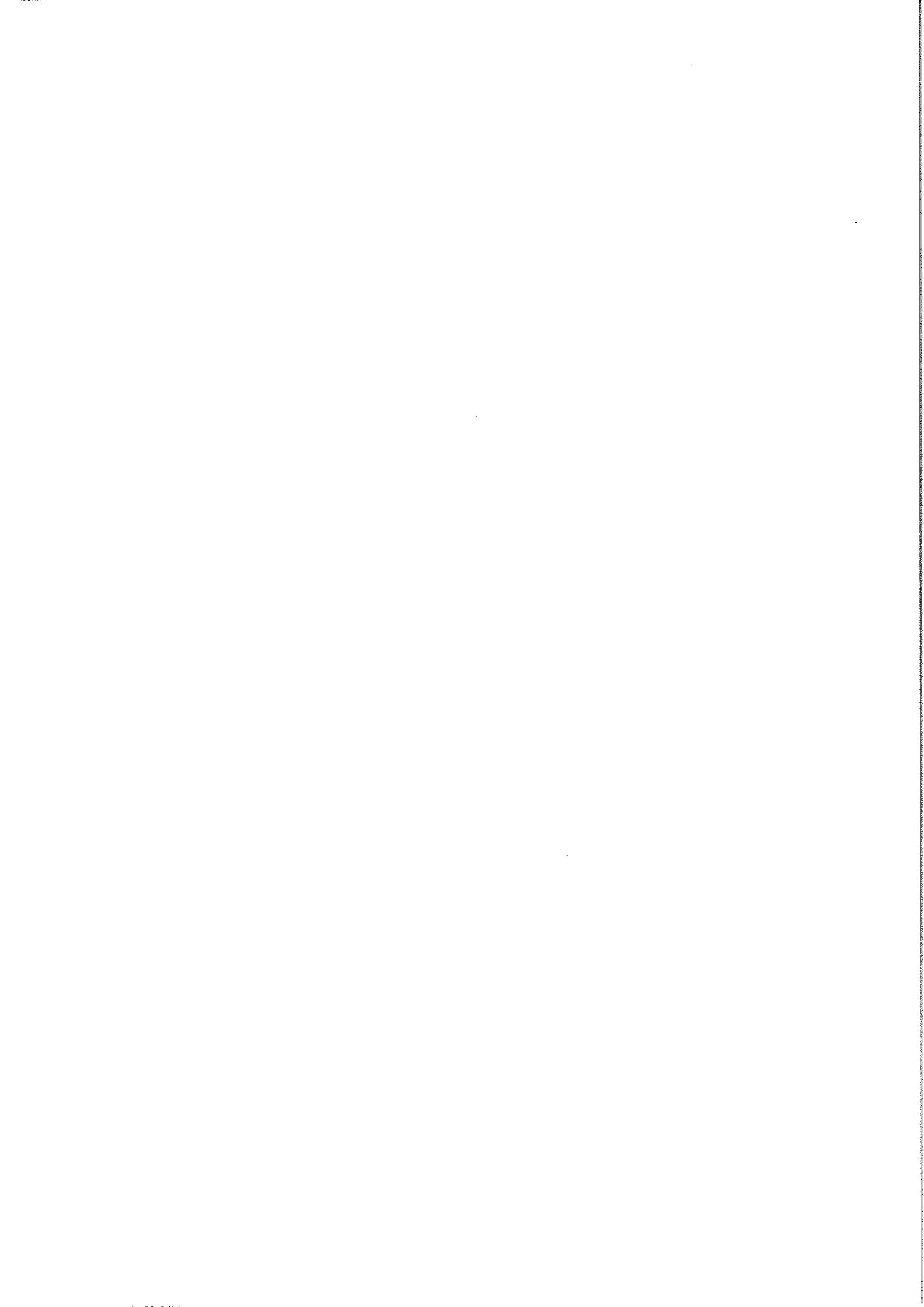


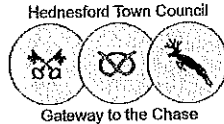

MEMBERSHIP

The membership will be open to all persons with a genuine interest in the abandoned Brindley Village its legacy and that of the military hospital the preceded it.

AIMS AND OBJECTIVES

- To inform visitors and members of the local community of the history of the area that was Brindley Village, the location of which was on Brindley Road, not to be confused with the more recently named area located at Brindley Heath Road.
- To preserve, for future generations, a documented history of both the place and the community.
- To give groups and individuals the opportunity to enter into a dialogue.
- To make the link between the physical features of the WW1 Military Hospital and explore its transformation to a village.
- To collect and record artefacts associated with village and hospital.
- To acknowledge and encourage the interest of people in the history of Brindley Village and surrounding area.
- To pursue original research that can be made available to all.
- To mount an exhibition related to a timeline of the place and the community.
- To gather oral histories
- To publish written information as the opportunity arises
- To hold regular informal meetings that will promote related dialogue across the generations.

PROCEDURE

- Publicise and promote the work of the group and organise meetings and events related to the topic.
- Invite contributions from local people and groups.
- Utilise the work of volunteers as necessary.
- Collate documents and photographs to form an archive.
- Produce displays and exhibitions
- Produce and maintain a contact network of people associated with Brindley Village.
- Encourage volunteers to take proactive role within the group.

The management committee will manage the groups work, make decisions and direct policy making.

MEETINGS.

- **Three committee member will need to be in attendance to form a quorum.**

FINANCE

- **There will be no charge to be a member of the group.**

OPENING STATEMENT PROJECT SUMMARY

There were two large WW1 training camps constructed on Cannock Chase that offered training facilities for up to 40,000 men at any one time.

While many foundations and other physical features can still be found, there are none any more visible or less documented than those of the Military Hospital.

Opened in 1916 this 1000 bed hospital became a feature of the landscape for nearly 40 years. We know there was an operating theatre, twelve long wards joined by a corridor, a chapel, an isolation hospital, separate nurse's quarters and of course a mortuary. Some of the buildings were made of wood but others were made of asbestos panelling.

The hospital remained open until 1924 looking after soldiers suffering from "shell shock" and gas poisoning.

At the point when the hospital was no longer necessary the site was bought by the local colliery company. Six of the long wards were demolished but the rest and some of the wooden huts underwent a transformation and were converted into, "bungalow" accommodation for its workforce. Brindley Village as it became known grew into a self-contained community, providing homes for 58 families. The miners were charged rent but electricity was provided by the colliery. Two of the wooden buildings were adopted by the education board and provided what later became a well-resourced school for some seventy children. The chapel was rededicated and became St Mary's Church; there was a pub and concert hall and a shop.

The village thrived and became a close-knit community. Eventually it became too expensive to maintain the, "huts", which were only ever designed to be temporary.

The inhabitants were relocated to a newly built housing estate. By 1954 most of the, "Villagers", had been moved. The last one move in 1955. The pub remained open for one more year and the school stayed open until 1959. The children being bused in daily.

The spirit of the Village moved with the community and has never left them. Each year fewer and fewer of the original inhabitants remain, although they are as passionate as ever about the life they shared.

It is our intention, through this project to capture the essence of life on Brindley Village. The project intends to trace the use of the site from its days as a military hospital to a village, and finally back to nature.

We want to trace the people who made their lives there and listen to their stories.

We would use volunteers to talk to past residents. We would try to capture the essence of the life that existed after the war and the extent of the legacy left by the soldiers.

The project would provide a focal point where we could collate information and photographic evidence and record stories. It seems that everyone has a story to tell, but as the population ages the memory becomes more blurred and details are lost.

We intend to follow the trail of these residents to provide us with an insight into life in the aftermath of World War one.

Describe the organisation's main purpose and regular activities.

The group has been formed specifically to formally research, document and trace all aspects of life on the Village and where records still exist the functioning, staffing and patients of the Military hospital.

Our aim is to involve community groups across all age ranges and generate a better understanding of the original use of the WW1 hospital site and the influence it still had after the end of the conflict.

We want to preserve a documented and visual history of both the place and the community. The group has contacted a number of past residents of the Village and has set up informal meetings to allow a free exchange of dialogue. This has proved to be as enjoyable as it is enlightening.

We are beginning to form a collection of photographic material that we hope to build on in the future.

We will be working towards producing an exhibition at our local museum. Our proposal application for display space has been accepted and a date will follow when our research has been completed and an exhibition designer has been appointed.

HERITAGE

The project will focus on the people that occupied the hospital and the inhabitants of the village that followed.

We are keen to research how these people were brought together and what happened subsequently.

For the hospital research, we will investigate war and medical records including the documentation provided by the local Commonwealth Cemetery.

It is hoped that through this project will uncover evidence that will throw light on the consequences of the pandemic that was Spanish Flu.

We intend to interpret Village life by using recorded stories, photographs, poems and modern art work. We shall interpret the log books and archived material from the record office to form a holistic picture of life spanning two world wars. We are keen to trace family roots and would like to shed light on their day to day living through their celebrations and their tragedies.

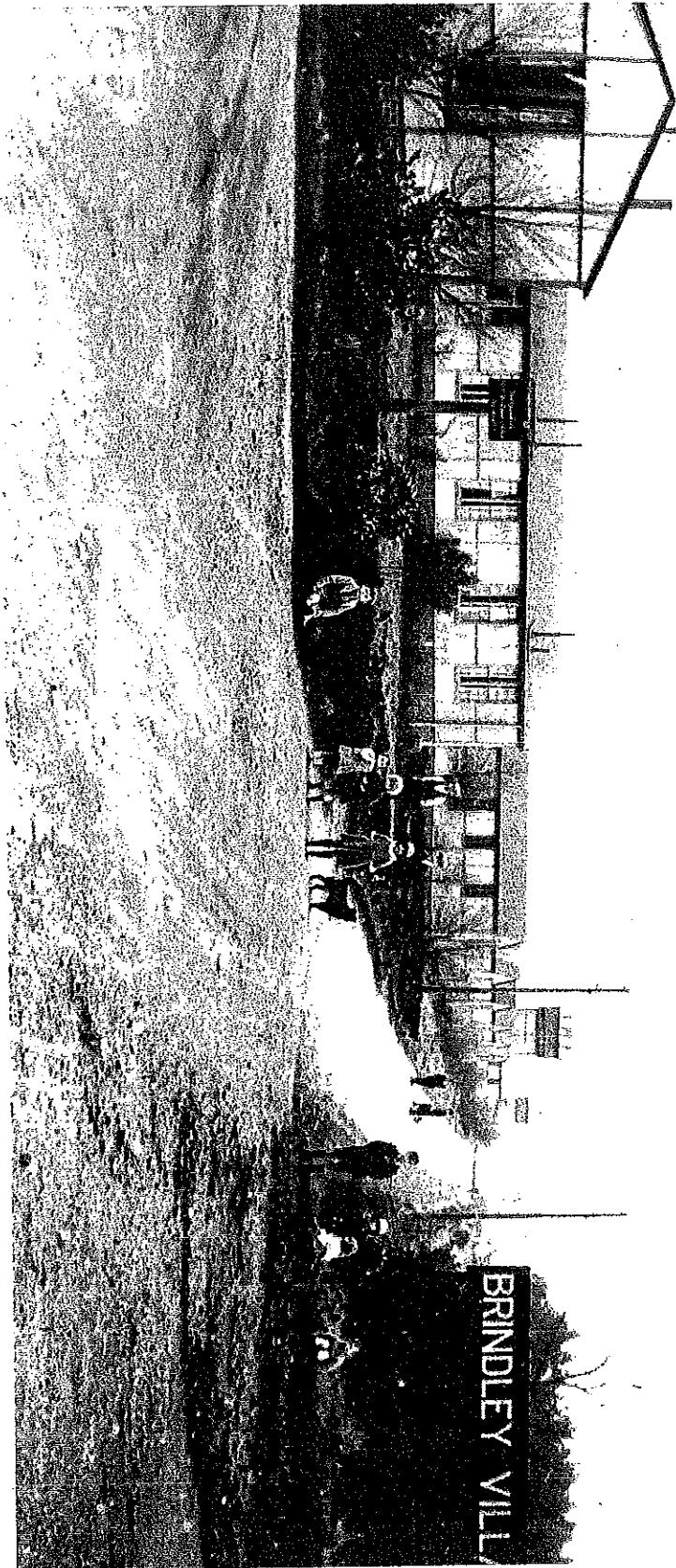
This project will provide a unique opportunity to bring the older community together in a series of informal workshops and give us the opportunities to make copies of postcards, letters and articles to form an archive.

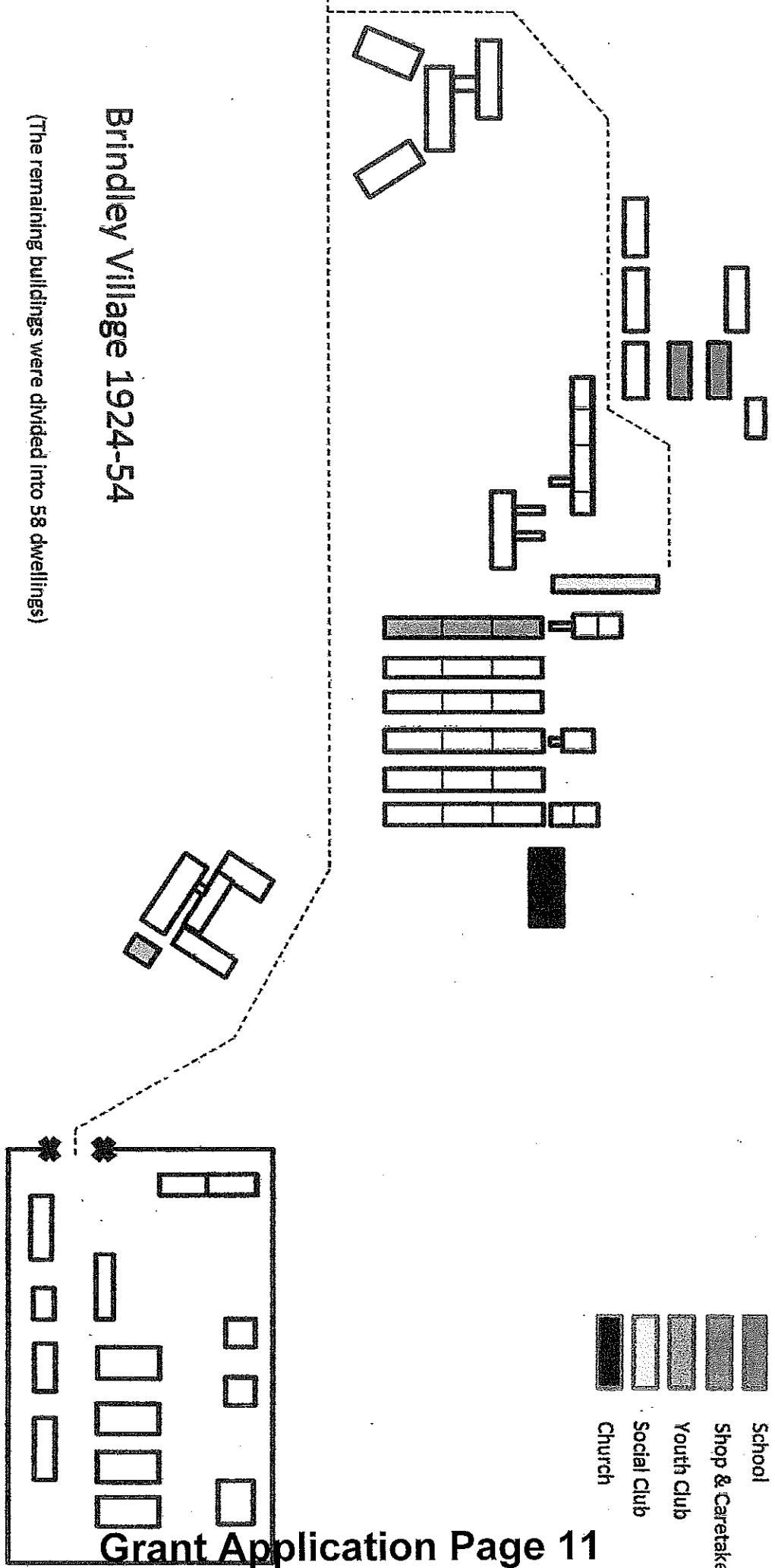
We will stage an exhibition in the main gallery of our local Museum where all sections of the community will be able to bear witness to the transformation through the decades. We intend to use modern art forms and Lidar images to interpret the landscape as it now.

We intend to run art workshops where children will be invited to experience a changing environment using acetate, "ghost buildings" and melting ice.

This project would provide a unique opportunity to share knowledge and experiences across several generations, and form a recorded history, that reflects the heritage of a mining community fighting their own battles in the years following the conflict.

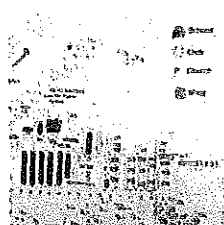




Brindley Village 1924-54

(The remaining buildings were divided into 58 dwellings)

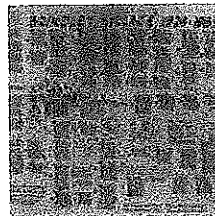
MODERN ART WORK THAT WILL FORM FINAL SECTION OF EXHIBITION.

In terms of developing a response I am still interested in the contrast between what is left as a residual memory of the village (pathways, fence posts, footings, all overgrown and only partly visible) and the photographic evidence of the site when it existed. I am still thinking through how to make work that can be left at the site, but in a non-invasive way.

My initial work has been to work on the digital images of the buildings and people who used them; I like the idea that these photographs capture a moment now lost as the physical buildings are no longer there, so I have been using Procreate to experiment with the process of adding to an old photograph and then starting to erode it again.



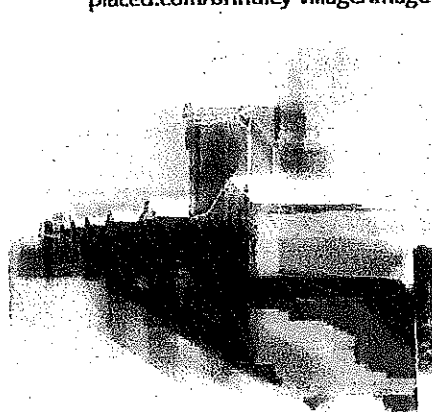
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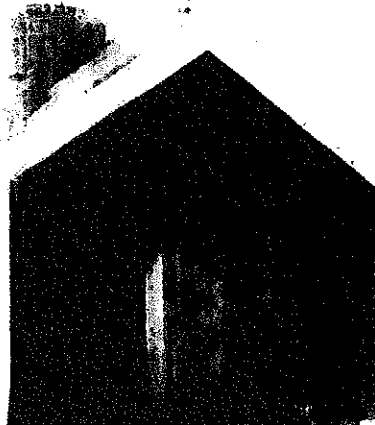

Heart of Hednesford AGM Wednesday June 14th, 2017

Chairman's Report.

The group has made amazing progress since amalgamation on August 31st 2016.

After a desperately disappointing HoHRP AGM that was very poorly attended, we contacted Friends of Hednesford Town to see if we had any common ground on which we could work together. After attending several FOHT meetings and finding that they had great intentions but little leadership, it was proposed that HOHRP and FOHT amalgamate to further our joint aims. Joining was unanimously agreed in principle at the last FOHT meeting on August 10th and at an EGM of HOHRP on August 31st, it was formerly agreed that the two groups join forces and be called simply Heart of Hednesford. A new committee was elected with me remaining as chairman.

Hard on the heels of this meeting, we formalised our plans with London Midland and Network Rail to adopt Hednesford Station and work commenced to fulfil the requirements for adoption and safe working. We had great help from both companies, especially from Faye Lambert who was appointed London Midland Community Engagement Officer and this came to fruition on January 13th 2017 at a ceremony on Hednesford Station with our newly appointed patron Amanda Milling MP in attendance along with an excellent turnout of adopters and dignitaries, including many from the town council. We were delighted to receive a cheque for £500 from Hednesford Lions and also great support from the town council with a cheque for £300 for which we are extremely grateful. A lot of preparation has gone on during the winter months including 2 litter picks to clear behind the platforms and I can report that we have purchased 10 hayrack planters which are due to be installed on the platform fences after the ongoing repainting of the station, new signage and fencing repairs are carried out. We regularly attend Cannock Chase Rail Promotion Group meetings and have been invited to attend the Chase Line Stakeholders Meeting where we hope to put forward our case for improvements to the infrastructure of the station, i.e. a new station building. We are now members of ACoRP, the Association of Community Rail Partnerships which will give us access to a great deal of help with the adoption. To date, we have 19 station adopters.

We are also in talks with CCDC and Groundforce to develop the landscape of the bank in Anglesey Street car park and have initiated plans for a dementia friendly sensory trail from the station to the signal box in Hednesford Park.

We have also been heavily involved with Hednesford's Neighbourhood Plan, sitting on the steering committee and have been consulted about the proposed alterations to Anglesey Street car park and we have also put forward a proposal to include Pye Green Valley (The Skelly) as a local green space to be included in the Cannock Chase Council Local Plan to increase the protection of the valley from any further development. We feel we have an excellent chance of success. Plans are ongoing to garner further support from all sections

of the community but were hampered by the impending county council elections in May and the general election.

HOH was also instrumental in the formation of Hednesford in Partnership, two of our most capable members, Carol Fittes and Lesley Yates stepped back from our group to help form HiP and now it is rapidly growing as a unifying group for all the organisations in town and has already achieved spectacular successes with fundraising for the Bridging Communities Art project for the station bridge and locations in town, and funding for the Summer Festival. Again, the seeds sown by HOH.

HOH were also instrumental in proposing to bring markets back to Hednesford and also to enter the town in the Best Kept Village competition, both of which have been taken on board by Hednesford in Partnership and we are supporting and assisting with both projects.

We had a stall at the Christmas event and our tombola completely sold out raising an excellent amount of funds for the group. We have carried out regular litter picks in the town and took part in a litter pick in Anglesey Park which helped to establish the Anglesey Park Friends Group. HOH members also worked with the Girls Air Venture Corp to prepare the Miners' Memorial ready for the dedication of the final phase on Saturday April 22nd and are carrying out regular clean ups to keep the memorial pristine. Again we are very grateful to Hednesford Town Council for their support.

HOH is now a thriving community group that has rapidly gone from strength to strength over the last year. We have tremendous support from all our members and will continue to work tirelessly for the benefit of our community and look forward to another year of co-operation with all the other groups in town.

I would like to thank everyone in Heart of Hednesford for your continuing support, confidence in me, our officers and enthusiasm for the tasks in hand. It is very much appreciated and it is an honour working on your behalf.
