Dear Clerk,

Cannock Chase Council introduced its Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) charging on 1 June 2015. CIL is one source of income for infrastructure projects to help ensure the development of the District is sustainable and supported by the appropriate infrastructure provision.

As per the CIL Regulations 59A-59E (2010, as amended) 15% (25% when a Neighbourhood Plan has been adopted) of the CIL funds collected from developments within a parish area (from developments occurring within that parish) are to be transferred to the relevant Council. Your Parish Council has been in receipt of such neighbourhood funds.

There is no CIL allocations process for CIL this year due to insufficient funds, but we would still welcome an update on your planned expenditure of such funds. As you may be aware, infrastructure projects on the CIL infrastructure list can be funded via a combination of sources including neighbourhood funds. Therefore, it would help to inform our decision making process on any bids received in future if we were aware of the Parish Council's intentions for the spend of its neighbourhood funds too.
